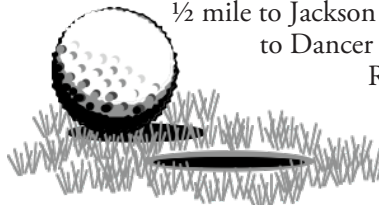

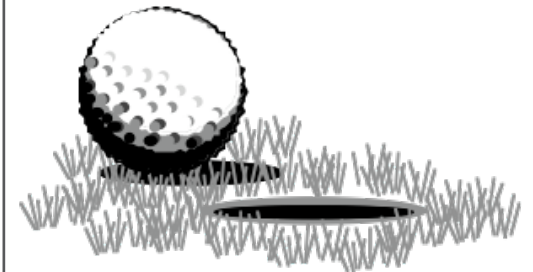

Who are we?

The Washtenaw Association for Community Advocacy (ACA), a nonprofit, 501(c)3 organization, was started in 1949 by a group of parents seeking educational opportunities for their children who had developmental disabilities. Over the last 60 years, ACA has broadened its focus and expanded its mission to pursue rights and opportunities for persons of all ages who have a wide range of disabilities. ACA is an affiliate of The Arc.

What do we do?

ACA's Mission is to ensure that people with disabilities and their families have choices, opportunities, and the supports they need to be fully included in community life through advocacy and education.

Why do we do it?

The board, staff and members of ACA envision a community that fully supports equality, dignity, respect, and inclusion for all people.

ACA is affiliated with The Arc Michigan, a state organization on developmental disability, and The Arc of The United States, a national disability rights organization.

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How is our work impacting you and your neighborhood?

ACA's work touches the lives of more than 1,000 individuals in Washtenaw County every month. A team of qualified and experienced advocates provides a wide range of services, from information and referral to individual advocacy.

During any given month:

- More than 200 individuals with disabilities receive advocacy and assistance to acquire and maintain housing, benefits, jobs, and appropriate levels of nutrition.
- More than 20 families receive advocacy services related to their child's schooling and education.
- Approximately 10 youths with disabilities who are preparing to age out of the foster care system are assisted to ensure that adult supports, services, and benefits will be in place when they reach age 18.
- Close to 30 students who are preparing to transition out of high school and into adult roles in their community receive support and advocacy services through our Young Adult Project.
- More than 100 families receive information and support regarding home help services, respite care, estate planning, and person-centered planning.
- 12 individuals with developmental disabilities who are beneficiaries of amenities trusts receive trustee services.
